## THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT

Made available \$228.6 million to Missouri to invest in home and community-based services to expand access to care for seniors and people with disabilities and raise wages for workers.<sup>1</sup>



#### **Vaccinations**



Over 83% of all Missouri seniors are vaccinated, better protecting them from COVID-19.<sup>2</sup>



### **Protection for Residents**

Made available \$14.9 million to help protect nursing home residents from COVID-19.3



## **Senior & Caregiver Services**

Provided a \$12.1 million investment to support older adults and family caregivers in Missouri.<sup>4</sup>



## **Food Security**

Secured a \$14 million investment to provide nutritious meals to seniors in Missouri.<sup>5</sup>
