THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT

Made available \$156.9 million to Tennessee to invest in home and community-based services to expand access to care for seniors and people with disabilities and raise wages for workers.¹



Vaccinations

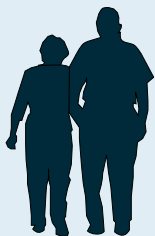


Over 83% of all Tennessee seniors are vaccinated, better protecting them from COVID-19.²



Protection for Residents

Made available \$9.9 million to help protect nursing home residents from COVID-19.³



Senior & Caregiver Services

Provided a \$13 million investment to support older adults and family caregivers in Tennessee.⁴



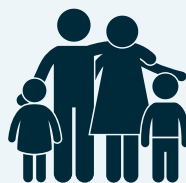
Food Security

Secured a \$15.1 million investment to provide nutritious meals to seniors in Tennessee.⁵



Combating Elder Abuse

Allocated landmark funding to better protect the one in ten older Americans who experience a form of elder abuse in a given year.⁶



Help for Grandfamilies

Established a National Technical Assistance Center to help the more than 76,000 grandfamilies raising grandchildren in Tennessee.⁷

THE INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT AND JOBS ACT

High-speed Internet



Will help the more than 305,000 Tennessee households with at least one senior that report no internet access to obtain high-speed internet.⁸



Mass Transit

Will improve transit and make it more accessible for the more than 1 million individuals with disabilities in Tennessee through an investment of at least \$651 million.¹⁰

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
