### THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT

Made available \$862.1 million to Texas to invest in home and community-based services to expand access to care for seniors and people with disabilities and raise wages for workers.<sup>1</sup>



#### **Vaccinations**



86% of all Texas seniors are vaccinated, better protecting them from COVID-19.<sup>2</sup>



#### **Protection for Residents**

Made available \$39.7 million to help protect nursing home residents from COVID-19.<sup>3</sup>



### **Senior & Caregiver Services**

Provided a \$43.4 million investment to support older adults and family caregivers in Texas.<sup>4</sup>



## **Food Security**

Secured a \$50.7 million investment to provide nutritious meals to seniors in Texas.<sup>5</sup>



## **Combating Elder Abuse**

Allocated landmark funding to better protect the one in ten older Americans who experience a form of elder abuse in a given year.<sup>6</sup>



## Help for Grandfamilies

Established a National Technical Assistance Center to help the more than 266,000 grandfamilies raising grandchildren in Texas.<sup>7</sup>

## **High-speed Internet**

Will help the more than 908,000 Texas households with at least one senior that report no internet access to obtain high-speed internet.



#### **Mass Transit**

Will improve transit and make it more accessible for the more than 3.2 million individuals with disabilities in Texas <sup>9</sup> through an investment of at least \$3.4 billion. <sup>10</sup>
