Making Approved Vaccines Free Starting in 2023



Ensures approved vaccines under Medicare Part D are free, helping over 246,600 Texans.¹



Lowering Insulin Copays Starting in 2023

Reduces Medicare copays to a maximum of \$35 per month, lowering insulin costs for nearly 125,500 Texans.²

Reducing Health Care Premiums Starting in 2023



Lowers Marketplace premiums for roughly 1.8 million Texans by hundreds of dollars per person, on average, in 2023.³



Helping Low-Income Americans Starting in 2024

Increases financial assistance to over 38,100 low-income Texans to help them afford their prescription medications.⁴

Capping Out-of-Pocket Costs



Starting in 2025

Caps prescription drug costs at \$2,000 a year for over 3.3 million Texans with Medicare Part D⁵− giving the nearly 106,000 Texans who will exceed this limit the help they need.⁶

Lowering Prescription Drug Prices Through Negotiation Starting in 2026

Beginning in 2026, Medicare-negotiated prescription drug prices will go into effect, reducing costs for certain high-cost drugs and out-of-pocket costs for seniors and people with disabilities.



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
