

Our veterans deserve a lot of things

Here's what they don't deserve: attempts to take advantage of their service. Yet every day, scammers attempt to defraud our veterans of their hard-earned benefits, steal their identity, or take their savings.

Together, we can fight back and take one small step to repay our veterans for the service they've given and the sacrifices they've made.

## THE BATTLE OUR VETS DIDN'T SEE COMING.

America's veterans are warriors, trained to handle anything a battlefield can throw at them. But there's one foe many veterans struggle to defeat: domestic fraud.



78% of our retired military men and women have been targeted by scams specifically crafted to exploit their military service history.

Sadly, veterans are twice as likely to actually fall for fraudulent schemes. In 2017, AARP research found that 16% of veterans have lost money to scammers, compared to only 8% of the non-military public.

Why? For starters, veterans implicitly trust fellow members of the military, making them vulnerable to imposters. Veterans also have a PTSD rate more than double the general public's, which can make it more difficult for them to recognize and combat the emotional manipulation used by scam artists.

### VA LOAN SCAMS

Offers to refinance VA loans at extremely low

### UPDATE YOUR FILE SCAM

An imposter, claiming to be from a governmer attempts to get a veteran's personal informatic their file" so they can maintain their benefits.

### SECRET VETERAN BENEFITS SCAM

Veterans are told they qualify for "secret" governograms or benefits that offer thousands of a first, they attempt to collect personal informat

### PENSION POACHING SCAM

Scammers often offer veterans lump sum pay front, in exchange for signing over all their futubenefit checks.

### AID AND ATTENDANCE SCAM

Veterans (or their family members) receive and move their assets into a living trust so that they for financial assisted-living benefits.

### VETERANS MAY ALSO ENCOUNTER GENERAL SCAMS

In addition to scams that specifically target there are an abundance of scams aimed at the public to which veterans are more susceptile include: phishing (attempts to gain access to accounts), fake tech-support calls, fraudulic card / loan schemes, attempts to "collect" fic bills, fraudulent charities, investment scams schemes, and more.
